ANNUAL REPORT 2015-16

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Our Gallery has a vision: to foster and promote artistic creativity and learning, while serving as a cultural centre that unites art and community. In looking back at this past year we can see how all of our work, as members and volunteers. is achieving this objective.

After our last Annual General Meeting, the Gallery held an acclaimed creative tribute to Canadian icon Joni Mitchell. Over 80 artists participated. Saturday evenings throughout November featured live music and poetry and a Gallery filled with people. In December, the force was awakened and our Star Wars celebration connected us with many local schools and voung families, many coming to the Gallery for the very first time.

2016 has been a year for expanding community partnerships. In January, GPAG hosted an exhibit and auction for the Town of Gibsons summer street banner project. In February we hosted a fundraiser for the Svrian Refugee Sponsorship project and a forum on embracing newcomers (part of a collaboration with Capilano U and Sunshine Coast Community Services' Welcoming Community program). March featured our annual Shout Out youth show, with work from the students of School District 46. This past spring the Gallery ran well attended art classes for kids, a watercolour workshop for adults and several talks led by our exhibiting artists. In May we continued our partnership with Welcoming Communities, with an ongoing monthly NFB film night (third Thursday of every month). In June we were a venue for Gibsons Landing Jazz Week. Summer at the Gallerv kicked off with a celebration of Squamish Nation arts and culture. Squamish Nation hereditary Chief Ian Campbell came to Gibsons, with a delegation of Squamish Nation artists, elders, councilors and members, to open an installation of contemporary and historical works of Squamish Nation art. As part of this celebration, community members were invited to visit the Chekwelp reserve and hear the story of how Squamish culture began, survived, and has now emerged strong and resilient in the modern age. We had two sessions of summer drawing classes for kids and a fall watercolour workshop for adults. Our community outreach continues this fall, as we plan the fundraiser "Visions of Home 2016" with Habitat for Humanity and work out arrangements for a future collaboration with Gibsons Recycling Depot & Zero Waste

In addition to all of this community work in 2016, the Gallery continued to host its usual year round rotation of diverse installations of art in multiple mediums. There were 17,249 recorded Gallery visits from September 2015 to August 2016 (compared to 15,708 visits from September 2014 to August 2015).



The message here is that GPAG offers the community more than just an art gallery. It offers a public accessible space filled with potential. Thank you to all of our members and volunteers for stepping up to turn this potential into reality!

Staffing our front desk, serving at receptions, working out how we are going to pay the bills...this Gallery is entirely dependent on our volunteers. Thank you to everyone who is able to provide the Gallery with your gift of time.

Thank you to our Office Manager Michael Aze and all of our Board, especially Shelley Fearnley, Sheila Mullen and Jeannie Harlow, whose terms as Board Members are now ending. Thank you to Joan Fallis for taking on the challenges of Treasurer, and Pat Bean for your dedication to our Gift Shop. Thank you to the Drope family for your continued support of this Gallery and the Eve Smart legacy.

EVE SMART LEGACY:

Who was Eve Smart? Eve Smart was an early Gibsons Public Art Gallery supporter and volunteer. When Eve became ill, she could no longer visit the Gallery (at its previous location, down a steep flight of stairs). When Eve passed away in 2011 she left her estate to GPAG, with the instructions that the funds be used to create a longterm accessible community arts venue. With this directive, the Gallery coordinated a major renovation of the vacant bank building at the centre of Gibsons Landing. The doors of a vibrant new arts centre opened in 2012. In 2015 the Gallery purchased the building. The Gallery now employs a manager and our Board of Directors is a diverse group of experienced and well trained community members. Thanks to Eve Smart's legacy gift, Gibsons now has a first class public arts facility that is well positioned for serving as a permanent community centre for celebrating all forms of art and culture.

MEMBERSHIP:

The word public is in our title because this Gallery aims to be an inclusive space, where everyone is welcome. That said, we are an organization that depends on members of the community to step up, join and maintain a Gallery membership and, when possible, help out as volunteers, leaders and donors. Membership has its privileges! Benefits include a 10% discount on all Gift Shop purchases over \$50, a 20% discount at Lisa's Framing & Art Supplies, discounts on GPAG lectures, workshops and classes, access to the Sunshine Coast's largest library of art books, a 20% admission discount at the Vancouver Art Gallery (until 31 DEC 2016), and voting rights at our Annual General Meeting. Become an active member and help shape the Gallery's future!

STRATEGIC PLANNING:

In November and December of 2015, Sunshine Coast Credit Union CEO Shelley McDade led the GPAG Board of Directors through workshops on governance and strategic planning. From those sessions, the Board identified three key administrative goals for the Gallery: long-term financial sustainability, efficient administration & governance, and greater community outreach. The Board has now implemented a number of administrative improvements (including a review of the Office Manager position, the creation of a Board Member orientation manual, the creation of an online membership system, and recruitment of needed skill sets in new board members) and has successfully reached out to build more partnerships with other community groups. While projects like the Visions of Home fundraiser will help generate revenue, the Board recognizes that the goal of long-term financial sustainability must now become a top GPAG priority.

The Gallery will initiate the transition to BC's new Societies Act next year, and we will have an opportunity to amend our bylaws as part of this transition at our 2017 AGM.

FINANCIAL REPORT HIGHLIGHTS:

This has been our first full year as owners of our fine gallery. Gallery and gift shop sales have increased by 40% over the previous year and the Gallery has hosted several successful events which have generated revenue. We are grateful for the continued support from the Town of Gibsons and the SCRD in providing grants in aid of our many community based activities and for the support from our wonderful sponsors. The purchase of our building for \$400,000 cash and a \$200,000 mortgage reduces our investment portfolio to approximately \$556,000. This in turn reduces our investment income in what has been a volatile and uncertain year for all investors. Despite carefully budgeting for our operating expenses we do have an operating deficit and will continue to do so unless we find other ways to increase revenue. Our financial statements have been prepared by Nelson Alvarez & Company Ltd. Copies are available to all. Please do not hesitate to contact me with any questions you may have. 
